Last Friday, I held a public meeting to discuss the Home Office proposal to open a detained asylum seeker centre at Northeye. I promised to hold a meeting when the Home Office had made a final decision on whether to bring the proposal forward, which was due to be made in January. I recently met with officials from the Environment Agency (EA) in Pevensey Bay to talk about the next phase of sea defences for the bay. We discussed progress on the Pevensey Bay to Eastbourne **Coastal Management Scheme** which will protect 10,000 homes, businesses and infrastructure for the next 100 years from 2025 when the current sea defence project is due to end. I will maintain a close interest in this project to ensure it delivers the protections required due to climate change.

It was good to meet with the


Samaritans to learn more about the vital work they do to help to prevent deaths by suicide.


Mountfield A21 Meeting
